

## Social Value Report

### What is this report about?

Colligo Labs is an independent organisation. They looked at a KeyRing service in Lambeth to understand whether it improves people's lives and saves money for public services.



### Who was involved?

The service supports 44 people with a range of needs, including learning disabilities, mental health needs and physical disabilities.

### What did Colligo Labs do?

Colligo Labs used a trusted method called Social Return on Investment (SROI). They followed HM Treasury Green Book rules and looked at impact over five years.

This means they:

- Looked at what changed in people's lives (like wellbeing, work, and stability)
- Looked at what services would normally cost
- Used conservative assumptions so results were not overstated

## What did they find?

The findings are clear:

- For every £1 invested in KeyRing, £4 of social value is created
- £2.50 of that £4 is direct, cashable savings to public services

## Where do the savings come from?

Savings come from avoiding high-cost services, supporting people into work and volunteering, and improved wellbeing.



## What else does KeyRing achieve?

- Employment rates around six times the local average
- Significant improvements in wellbeing
- Fewer crises and better long-term stability
- Strong outcomes for people with a range of support needs



## Who benefits financially?

The report shows savings for:

- Local authorities
- The NHS
- The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP)
- The Ministry of Justice

This shows that while councils often fund services, the benefits are shared across the system.
